trails & waysides*



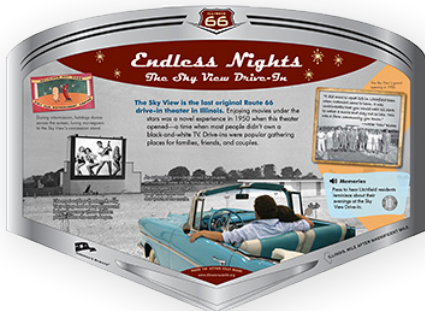

Place your hand on a spot on the exhibit panel to hear the distant calls of apes. / At the Great Cats exhibit (left), Sumatran tigers and African lions roar on command with a touch of the exhibit panel. / Below, weatherproof mailboxes house FlashAudio components delivering bird sounds when a visitor opens a mailbox door.

31 Route 66 Wayside exhibits are placed at sites with historic significance along the road in Illinois. Each exhibit tells the story of the site's relationship to Route 66. Some include audio on demand, playing on FlashAudio components supplied by Signal-Innova.
